

# RECORD OF PROCEEDINGS

## Minutes of Paris Township Trustees

### Held October 6, 2025

President James Kiko called the meeting to order at 7:00PM at the township hall with Trustees Michael Stewart and James Glavan present.

#### Approval of Minutes

Mr. Stewart moved to dispense with the reading of the minutes of the last meeting & approve as submitted. Seconded by Mr. Glavan. Approved. Financial reports approved as printed.

#### Minutes

Pam Stoller said the minutes need updated on the website.

#### Matt Kishman

Ohio State Representative Mr. Kishman talked about statehouse issues currently happening such as discussions on property taxes and congressional districts.

#### Cemetery Rules

Thomas and Sandra Passmore asked about cemetery rules changing. Mr. Kiko said the rules have changed over time. The rules are listed on signs at Liberty Cemetery. Cemetery Sexton Kirkpatrick said about 65% of burials are cremations now. Thirteen foundation are to be poured next week he said. There was a discussion about a "no name alley" in Robertsville with the Passmores and illegal burning taking place also mentioned by Mr. Glavan.

#### Grants

Fiscal Officer Evanich reported completing paperwork for the Park Ave. grant and the MORE grant from OTARMA.

#### Road Report

Road Superintendent Todd Kirkpatrick reported fixing Baywood St. where the asphalt meets the bricks. There was one funeral. Ditching along the east part of Telpahak St. He is using the signs for rule breakers at Liberty Cemetery.

#### Cybersecurity

Mr. Stewart reported that the prosecutor's office said our Cybersecurity Policy is good.

#### Other township items

Mr. Glavan reported there were lost goats in Paris Township, but the goats were found. Mr. Kiko said he met with the owner of the previous Stallion property on Baird Ave. along with Fiscal Officer Evanich and Road Superintendent Kirkpatrick this morning concerning leasing the building. Mr. Kiko said leasing is not helpful to the township at this point.

No further business, Mr. Kiko made a motion, seconded by Mr. Glavan to adjourn and pay bills of \$64,990.80. Approved.
